WEDNESDAY WELCOME TABLE



As most of you know, I am passionate about creative worship experiences—enhanced through music, art and drama, silence, and other ways of engaging God's holy presence. You see, I am convinced that the good news of Christ's redemptive power remains the same from generation to generation, but the ways in which we communicate the good news must be ever-changing. Over the past six months, this conviction has guided me to explore how we might adapt our Wednesday night program to welcome more people. With some tweaks, might our Wednesday night program become another worship service? More contemporary in nature? More inviting to people of all ages?

My research led me to the idea of a Wednesday Welcome Table. And with the blessing of Session, we are going to give it a try during Lent. Then at the end of our experiment, we will assess the results. If it does not make a positive impact in the life of the church, we may chalk it up to a good experience and let it go. If it holds promise, however, we may consider adopting the model in August when we return from our summer break.

Allow me to share the premise of Wednesday Welcome Table which will start Ash Wednesday, February 26 in the Fellowship Hall. While we will meet each week from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., our last Wednesday Welcome Table will occur on a Thursday

(Maundy Thursday, to be exact). We will share a meal much as we do now, but after people get their food, worship will begin. It will be participatory in nature—not preaching so much as exploring Scripture together. The service will include contemporary music played on the piano and guitar and each service will end with Communion by Intinction.

Concerning the menu, let's get creative. Instead of the food being catered, teams of 2-4 people will provide a variety of dishes—think potato bar—taco bar—healthy southern fare—the sky is the limit. Ray Chitty and Bart Greer have already signed up to make something tasty. Bryan, Sissy, Kinney and I are making plans for Hoppin' John Stew with loads of fixings. I will be recruiting other teams to prepare food as well. (Note: to be reimbursed for your ingredients, just turn in your receipts along with the appropriate form located in the church office.)

Please be in prayer about participating in Wednesday Welcome Table—in whatever way you choose. Also, consider inviting friends and neighbors. This is going to be loads of fun. Really!


